

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

1. Will attendees have access to the Power Point presentation slides after the webinar?

2. Will the i2 be offered on an annual basis?

The AHF Board of Trustees has discussed the possibility of having this become a regular grant offering but at this point in time no decisions have been made. We are anxious to go through the current process to see what kinds of programs are brought forward and how successful the initiative turns out to be.

3. What is the grant period? Does it have to be a 3 year grant?

The i2 grant could be a 1 -3 year grant.

4. Can you have more than 1 partner? What is the maximum number of partners you can have?

No more than one partner is required to apply for the i2 grant. The application does have space for up to 5 partners but you may have as many “authentic” partners as is needed to fully implement the program. If there are more than 5 partners please contact AHF staff and we will provide you with a way to submit additional partner information.

5. Is the i2 grant one grant of \$1M or will several grants be awarded within the \$1M?

The i2 is one grant of up to \$1M for up to a three year period.

6. Will AHF fund programs that serve subsections of the target populations?

Yes.

7. Will programs that serve people that live along the border be considered?

Yes, programs that address access to health and healthcare of the target populations within the Greater San Diego Region will be considered. This area includes all of San Diego and Imperial Counties as well as the border region.

8. Where will the Pitch Meeting be held?

The August 5th Pitch Meeting will be held in San Diego County at a specific location to be determined.



9. 2000 characters does not seem like a lot of space to describe our program. Is there any flexibility to the character count?

The Letter of Intent is meant to be a brief but succinct description of the problem you have identified, the proposed solution, and your partnership's qualifications for implementing that solution. If after reading the LOI, the AHF Program Committee and Board of Trustees are interested in hearing more about the program you will be given the opportunity to provide a more detailed presentation of your idea at the Full Proposal stage.

10. Are there any restrictions on what kinds of things the grant money can be spent on (i.e. medical equipment)?

AHF is not placing any restrictions on what the grant money can be spent on. It is the applicant's responsibility to make a plausible case for how funds are to be spent and why the expenditures are necessary to ensure the success of the program.

11. Will AHF facilitate or help connect organizations that are looking a partner?

Yes, AHF would be happy to assist in connecting organizations looking for partners. We have convened a panel of local experts who are familiar with San Diego's traditional and nontraditional healthcare landscape that are available to provide guidance and make suitable referrals.
